#### The European Student Card Initiative (ESCI)

Flagship initiative to make the European Education Area more inclusive, digital and interconnected.

- Facilitates digital exchanges among higher education institutions (HEIs), simplifies student mobility and builds a shared European identity for higher education students.
- All ECHE holders and HEIs participating in a European Universities alliance, commit to implementing the ESCI.
- The Council Recommendations on building bridges for effective European higher education cooperation (5 April 2022) and Europe on the Move – learning mobility opportunities for everyone (13 May 2024), call on Member States to support and widen ESCI implementation.






## Erasmus Without Paper (EWP) overview









#### **EWP** statistics


- Over 3,200 higher education institutions (HEIs) connected across all Erasmus+ programme countries
  - 20 third-party providers
  - 38 in-house systems
  - EWP Dashboard: EC-funded solution
- 2/3 of all ECHE holders exchange successfully on EWP.
- Erasmus+ App backend connected to the EWP Dashboard and HOME module



#### Steady growth in digital exchanges through EWP

There are close to 250,000 Erasmus+ outgoing student mobilities for studies every year.

- Light blue: total number of outgoing student mobilities for studies (SMS) as reported in the Beneficiary Module (BM).
- Dark blue: percentage of digital learning agreements (DLAs) signed through the EWP Network as reported in the EWP Stats Portal.



<sup>\*</sup> The number of DLAs completed and the number of outgoing students is not a perfect match due to differences in the academic years compared (BM: 2022-2023 and EWP: 2023-2024) and overall yearly increases in mobilities.



## Main findings

- Cyprus maintained 100% digitalisation rate at the national level in 2024 – in alignment with the European Commission's 95% digitalisation target.
- **Projections** for the ongoing academic year (2024-2025) indicate that **Cyprus will maintain this rate** in the next exercise (2025).
- The EWP Dashboard is predominantly used by Cypriot HEIs.
- Cyprus' 100% digitalisation reflects aggregated data. At the institutional level, digitalisation rates may vary.
- While some institutions exceed 100%, this surplus compensates for lower digitalisation rates at others.
- Declines in digitalisation rates at institutional level highlight the need for targeted support/outreach to sustain the positive adoption levels.





# European Student Card (ESC) overview





#### The European Student Card (ESC)

The ESC is <u>not a new card</u>. It's **higher education institutions' current cards upgraded with a set of common visual and technical elements** that HEIs can add via the ESC-Router.


The ESC can be adapted to **digital** and **physical formats** with any type of technology (e.g., chip technology, magnetic stripe, etc.).

#### **European Student Identifier (ESI)**

A digital identifier used to uniquely identify students of European higher education institutions, linking them to a given ESC

#### **European Student Card Number (ESCN)**

A unique card identifier that serves to identify student cards belonging to a given institution and to validate them



#### **European Student Card logo**

Integrates the EU flag with the text "European Student Card" and a QR code, certifying the card's authenticity across Europe and enabling the validation of student status



#### The European Student Card (ESC)

The ESC adds a **European dimension to existing higher education student cards** so students can have their student status easily recognised across Europe.








- Simplified access to student services during mobility with their existing student card, just as local students (e.g., libraries, dormitories, discounts, etc.)
- Shared European student identity

- Securely validate the student card of incoming mobile students
- **Support reciprocity** in service provision to mobile students.
- Streamline the verification of student status
- Gain access to a wider network of users

#### Main insights

- 5 Cypriot HEIs are registered in the ESC-R (12.5% of all ECHE holders in Cyprus)
- None is actively issuing ESCs. Two have issued 1-3 ESCs, likely for testing purposes.
- It's important to identify any obstacles that keep Cypriot HEIs from issuing ESCs – especially those institutions already connected to the ESC-R.
  - The new ESC-R, hosted in the European Commission's cloud, brings additional security, scalability and a better user experience.
  - The **new ESC logo** is **easier** to implement and doesn't require the purchasing of holograms, facilitating ESC adoption.
  - The ESC Service Catalogue will allow HEIs and service providers to list the services they provide to ESC cardholders.



# ESCI - Outlook until the end of the Erasmus+ programme







#### Guiding principles

- Consolidation and improvement of existing processes.
- Continuation of services and infrastructure at least until the end of the current programming period.
- Stability and scale.
- Building on current investments.
- Based on thorough consultation of users and providers to establish future requirements.

Accelerate issuance of ESCs within and across all programme countries



Explore partnerships with key student services to bring added value to ESC holders



Launch of the ESC Service Catalogue



Increase rollout of digital European Student Cards



#### **Erasmus Without Paper**

- Reach 95% digitalisation target of DLAs concluded in the EWP network
- Introduction of nominations (beta testing) with a gradual roll out until the end of 2025
- Review Transcript of Records modalities of deployment (2026 onwards)
- Prepare future IIA renewal scenarios (ongoing consultation)
- Acceptable use policy revision and implementation (2025)

#### **ESCI Champions**


- Institutions that have made **significant progress** in **implementing the European Student Card Initiative** (ESCI) and commit to **sharing best practices** with their peers.

- Cypriot ESCI Champion: University of Cyprus!





